- Designate on a site map exactly where the snow will be piled up and share it with your community so they will be aware of this plan. You may also want to designate any special no parking areas if needed.
- Prepare emergency generators if needed, for power outages
- Be sure and order and have on hand any snow removal chemicals if you are doing this activity in house.
